# Welcome to the Faculty of Law Online Summer School 2022

The declaration of Mark Zuckerberg inversing billions of dollars into the metaverse marked a new era of a novel technology named the metaverse. The aim of this summer school is to provide the participants with a holistic understanding to metaverse from a technical and legal perspectives.

The metaverse, as a newly emerging phenomenon adds another immersive dimension to the already existing cyberworld. Hence, the interconnectedness of three hypothetical worlds; the physical world, cyber world and the metaverse will pose questions and threats to almost all aspects of life. As a result, several legal theories will be challenged in terms of their ability to govern this novel technology. What makes the metaverse technology grabs the attention of the entire legal community worldwide is that it is going to disrupt many legal areas such as the criminal law, the civil law, IP law and administrative law. For instance, a person getting severe bodily injuries while playing a game in the metaverse, or a contract concluded between avatars, and whether to grant legal personhood to avatars require a comprehensive legal approach to govern those emerging developments. It is worth noting that governments are already playing a key role in investing in this technology in collaboration with the private sector.

The exacerbating pace with which technology develops necessitates equipping the entire legal community with a solid comprehension of the metaverse. To that end, a combination of theoretical and practical sessions will be held by a panel of renowned experts who will offer participants insights into cutting-edge research from the fields of IT Law and metaverse. 


# 2<sup>nd</sup> Summer School 2020



The Centre for Law and Emerging Technologies offered an opportunity for graduates and students to participate in its third summer school, specifically designed for bright, motivated participants looking to further their law studies and enhance their legal knowledge. The sessions were delivered online with our first-class teaching experts in the field of law and technology. Summer school 2021 was designed to offer a new perception of knowledge in the area of Legal and Technical Aspects of Digital Evidence.

The summer school offered by the faculty of law at the British University in Egypt, participants had introduced the history of digital evidence, its types, sources and characteristics. The programme also elucidated the growing tech challenges, such as Deepfakes, which may undermine the credibility and authenticity of digital evidence. Additionally, the ethical, legal and technical requirements of handling digital evidence as well as the way courts have approached such an unconventional type of evidence, was fully explained in light of the national and international regulatory frameworks.
